APPROVAL OF THE AGENDA

Mr. Blumenthal asked for approval of the Agenda and with unanimous consent the Agenda was approved

- 3. Borough Engineer Khal Hassan stated that his report is in the packet and there was nothing to address this evening. Church St project is near completion. Phase IIA for MacKenzie Park. Bids are recommendations will be ready for November 1st. Pennoni provided assistance with the sinkhole on Apple. Mr. Hassan stated that a meeting took place with PennDOT and MLP Ventures with potential traffic concerns

1. The Council Shall evaluate and take potential action to approve Resolution 2024-19 recognizing the Borough of West Conshohocken Sesquicentennial.

The Council shall evaluate and take potential action on Ordinance No. 2024-04, which adds a new chapter to the Borough of West Conshohocken Code entitled "repairs of Motor Vehicles on Public Streets and Sidewalks", which regulates and prohibits the repair of motor vehicles on public streets and sidewalks within the Borough.

Mr. Cella questioned the difference between repairs on vchicles of older vehicles as to this resolution. Councilmember Gale stated that this would only be for vehicles that are being repaired that are affecting traffic.

Borough Solicitor Iannozzi suspending the public meeting into a public hearing and introduced the following exhibits: B-1: Email to Times Herald, B-2 Proof of Publication, B-3 Letter to Law Library B-4 Ord 6-2 legal notice. Mr. Iannozzi asked Council and Public for any questions to which there were none. Mr. Iannozzi closed the public hearing and proceeded to public meeting.

3. The Council shall evaluate and take potential action on 237, 239, 303 Moorehead Avenue's Amended Resolution 2024-18.

Mr. Iannozzi stated that this matter was previously approved, and this is an amended resolution for a two- hour firewall separation to a one-hour fire rated wall. Applicant is consolidating these lots and building four townhomes with sprinkler system. This has been reviewed with the Fire Company and Fire Marshall. Applicant is present as well as Rich O'Brien, zoning officer. No questions or comments were made. Mr. Blumenthal asked for a motion to approve.

 Attorney Edmund J. Campbell's request to discuss amending the Borough of West Conshohocken's Zoning Code to provide for data center uses within he Borough's HI Zoning District

Mr. Iannozzi briefed Council that our zoning code does not include data centers'. Edmund Campbell presented data centers in the Hl District. Mr. Iannozzi indicated that concerns would be level of noise, submitting a Conditional Use with noise study. Amelia Gale questioned if West Conshohocken had resources for fire safety. Mr. Campbell responded that data centers have their own internal safety. Councilperson Gorney indicated that she believes there is tremendous noise. Jeff Ewing asked what other HI districts are in the Borough to which this could related to and the ability to have other data centers. Councilperson Conicello-Emery asked about advancements in the data centers and use standards. Councilperson Gale stated that she prefer staff being the process of drafting an ordinance. Mr. Blumental asked council for a motion to investigate further on this matter to bring to Council.

Guy Davis, resident, suggested that there should be further use investigations in the HI District

Dave Frankenfield, resident, congratulated the Borough on the 150th anniversary. Mr. Frankenfield had some concerns on the data centers with the current and generator backup and revenue to the Borough

Walter Gleba, wanted to second Mr. Frankenfield's comment and stated that we should protect our residents. Mr. Gleba also wanted to ask about updates to AirBNB's to which Mr. Blumenthal responded that Council will not be answering at this time and that it is being researched and legal rights. Mr. Gleba provided Council a copy of the Supreme Court decision in the State of Pennsylvania.
